The petition for a writ of certiorari before judgment in the above-captioned case was granted on February 15, 2019, and the Court heard oral argument on April 23, 2019.

On Thursday, May 30, 2019, respondents New York Immigration Coalition, et al. moved the district court to issue an order to show cause why the government should not be sanctioned. NYIC Pls.' Letter Mot. for an Order to Show Cause, *State of New York v. U.S. Dep't of Commerce*, No. 18-CV-2921 (S.D.N.Y. May 30, 2019), ECF No. 595.
